Beatitude Verses

6 from Octoechos for Resurrection 4 from Triodion: Canon Ode 6

People: In Your kingdom remember us, O Lord, when You come into Your

kingdom.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted!

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth!

Reader: O Christ the Savior of the world, remember us as You remembered the

robber on the Cross; and count us all worthy of Your heavenly kingdom, O

You who alone are compassionate.

People: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall

be filled!

Reader: Listen, O Adam, and rejoice with Eve; for he who of old stripped you both

naked, and took all of us captive by deception, has been defeated by the

People: Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God!

Reader: Rejoice, O wise myrrh-bearing women, who were first to behold the

resurrection of Christ, and who proclaimed to the apostles the glad tidings

of the restoration of the whole world!

People: Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs

is the Kingdom of Heaven!

Reader: O apostles, you are manifestly the friends of Christ and are to be

enthroned with Him in glory: entreat Him with boldness, that He intercede

for us, for you are His disciples.

People: Blessed are you when people revile you, persecute you, and say all kinds

of evil against you falsely for my sake!

<u>Reader:</u> O Savior, in Your compassion You clothed me in Eden with a divinely

woven garment; but persuaded by the devil, I neglected Your

commandment and was stripped naked in my wretchedness.

People: Rejoice, and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven!

Reader: O miserable soul, you have departed far from God through your

carelessness; you have been deprived of the delight of Paradise and parted from the angels; you have been led down into corruption. O how

fallen you are!

People: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Reader: Almighty God, have mercy and take pity on the work of Your hands. I have

cut myself off from the choir of Your angels; but I entreat You loving Lord,

do not reject me.

People: Now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

<u>Reader:</u> O Mary chosen by God, Queen of the world, you have given birth to the

Lord who is King of all and Redeemer. I am a prisoner and an exile from

the glory of Paradise: I entreat you, call me back.

Let us walk decently, as in the day; not in parties and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and lustful acts, and not in strife or jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ and do not think how to satisfy the flesh and its lusts. Accept the one who is weak in faith, but not to enter into arguments over disputable matters. One has faith to eat all things while the weak eats only vegetables. The one who eats everything should not look down on the one who does not eat. The one who does not eat should not judge the one who eats because God has accepted him. Who are you who judge someone else's servant? He stands or falls to his own master! Yes, that one will be made able to stand, because God has the power to make someone stand.
