Lord? Christ is risen, as He foretold. Let your tears cease and be changed

into joy.

People: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Reader: O faithful, let us praise the Trinity in Unity, glorifying the Father with the

Son, and the Spirit who is of the same essence with the Son, and who

with the Father is without beginning and eternal God.

People: Now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Reader: O Theotokos, like a vineyard you conceive untilled in your womb the

Cluster of grapes from which pours out like wine for us, torrents of

immortality, even eternal life.

Reader:

In those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, a complaint arose from the Hellenists against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily service of food distribution. The Twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not appropriate for us to abandon the word of God in order to serve tables. Therefore, select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom. We will appoint them over this necessary task and devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." These words pleased the whole multitude, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them. Thus, the word of God spread and the number of disciples greatly multiplied in Jerusalem, and a large number of Jews became obedient to the faith.

Deacon: With fear of God, with faith and love, draw near.
