Beatitude Verses

- People:*** In Your kingdom remember us, O Lord, when You come into Your kingdom.
Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth!
- Reader:*** O Savior, we offer You the cry of the robber, and we pray: Remember us in Your kingdom.

- People:*** Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God!
- Reader:*** Risen from the tomb, You met the myrrh-bearing women; and You told Your disciples to announce Your arising.
- People:*** Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven!
- Reader:*** Upon seeing You, O Christ the Light, those who slept in darkness, in the nethermost parts of Hades, were raised from the dead.
- People:*** Blessed are you when people revile you, persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for my sake!

Reader: O ever-memorable Hilarion, you dried up the uprisings of the poisonous passions, restraining them with the medicine of fasting, and you cried aloud: There is none as holy as our God, and none more righteous than You, O Lord!

People: Rejoice, and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven!

Reader: O ever-memorable Hilarion, having cut away garments of mortal skin with the knife of abstinence, you fashioned a robe of salvation, crying out to your Creator: You are our God, and there is none more holy than You, O Lord!

People: **Glory** to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Reader: Strengthened by the hope of eternal life, and brought to God by the hands of the divinely wise Anthony the Great, O venerable God-bearer Hilarion, emulating him you became a beacon, shedding rays of all-glorious miracles.

People: **Now** and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Reader: He Who formed all things by His divine desire formed Himself into a man, taking form in your womb, O Theotokos. To Him we now cry out: You are our God, and there is none more righteous than You, O Lord!

In Damascus, the governor of King Aretas guarded the city, desiring to arrest me. But I was let down in a basket along the wall through a window, and this is how I escaped from his hands. Without a doubt, it is not profitable for me to boast, but I will now discuss visions and revelations from the Lord. I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up into the third heaven (whether it was in the body, I do not know, or whether out of the body, I do not know; God knows). Yes, I know such a man how he was caught up into Paradise, and heard ineffable words, which it is not lawful for anyone to utter. On behalf of such a person, I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except in my weaknesses. If my intention is to boast, I will not be foolish: I will speak the truth. But now, I shall stop, so that no one may think more of me than what is seen in me or heard from me. Because of the tremendous greatness of these revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan that torments me, so that I would not be too exalted. Concerning this thing, I begged the Lord three times that it might depart from me, but he replied to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." And so, it is with joy that I would rather find glory in my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest on me.
