- Roots in the Jewish Temple
 worship
- Liturgy means the "work of the people
- Eucharist, the Holy Mystical Thanksgiving in Communion with God and man



Liturgy of the Word or Synaxis (Gathering)

The Litany of Peace Prayers for peace

Antiphonal singing - Saint Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, introduced antiphonal singing into the early Christian Church. Readings from the Old Testament, Psalms 102 and 145 are chanted

The Little Entrance: Processional bringing the Gospels to the Altar

The Trisagion Thrice Holy Hymn "Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us."

Epistle (NT letter) or Apostolic Reading

Gospel Reading

Homily: The teaching of the Gospel

Litany of Fervent Supplications: Prayers for individual need and those of the entire world

Prayers for the Catechumens and the Faithful

Liturgy of the Faithful or Eucharist

Preparation of the Transfer of the Gifts

The Cherubic Hymn We mystically represent the Cherubim

The Great Entrance: Processional bringing the prepared bread and wine to the altar

The Litany of the Prothesis: Prayers of preparation for the Eucharist

The Kiss of Peace: Must be at peace with God and each other to partake in the Eucharist

The Nicene Creed recited by all

The Anaphora The lifting up of our sacrifice to God

Eucharistic prayer: "It is worthy and right to bless You..."

Anamnesis: Prayers remembering God and the saints in living communion

Epiclesis The calling upon of the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine to the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the climax of the liturgy.

The Lord's Prayer: Our Father in the heavens, hallowed be your name...

Holy Communion: In the common cup, the faithful receive the Body and Blood of Christ

Thanksgiving after Holy Communion

Dismissal: The people of God are prepared to take the Gospel to the world
