



offer our children, or our community, is just the ethnic, cultural trappings of a robust faith, then we cannot in all seriousness be surprised that our children then value the true Faith so little. As precious as some of the entertaining aspects are of our youth outreach, those programs WILL NOT be enough (and I know this because they are not enough now) to hold our children to the Faith in any serious and long term commitment. If we are using the excuse "Well, we must keep them connected to the Church," then it is time to realize it isn't working.

We must continually offer them the "power of Jesus Christ" to transform and transfigure their lives to fit them for knowing God and enjoying Him forever. The liturgical and sacramental life (the mystical life) of the Faith is the best and most ancient path to theosis (the process of moving ever closer to God and uniting with Him) and deep union with the Holy Trinity, Who is our life.

But all of this is predicated on us believing this ourselves. St Paul wisely declared, "I have been crucified with Christ: it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." (Galatians 2: 20).



If we have any hope of actually being Orthodox Christians indeed, and not merely by the happy accident of our birth, we must enter seriously into the transformative life of the liturgy and the Eucharistic life of the Church. This is never a mere option. It is never just an alternative. It is never reducible to an experience reserved only for saints and monks. We will only pass on what we actually possess to our children. If we pass on a weak, anaemic, and mediocre faith, we simply cannot be surprised when our children disappear from our parishes. Nor should we be surprised when the Holy Spirit takes this precious Faith from us and gives it to those who will appreciate it.

Precious ones and children loved by God and favored with such a treasure and a spiritual head start that you have had this treasure gifted to you from your earliest days! We cannot allow the hard work ahead of us to keep us locked in the mediocrity and failed practices that do not strengthen the Faith.
