### **MINIMISING SPREAD OF COVID AND OTHER COMMUNICABLE RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

Those feeling unwell physically must refrain from attending until they are certain of their diagnosis. Symptoms may include, but not limited to, cough, cold, runny nose, fever, headache, sore throat...

Feel free to wear fitted face masks covering the mouth and nose.

Disinfect hands by using hand sanitizer which is conveniently located at the candle table, kitchenette, and store room.

Disinfect hands by washing them thoroughly with soap for 40-60 seconds. Avoid touching your mouth, nose, eyes and ears with your hands.

Rear doors will be left open and air purifier/air-con/heater on for extra ventilation.

If you must cough or sneeze, do so using a tissue or handkerchief. If you are able to do so, exit the premises promptly to safely cough or sneeze into a tissue or handkerchief, or cough or sneeze into your closed elbow away from others.

In general, follow recommendations and instructions given by the Superior and official health authorities.

## WHS Asbestos Report (October 2024)

As part of the insurance renewal process, the Diocese has asked all its parishes for an Asbestos building inspection.

Our inspection has indicated the presence of Asbestos in the building. The report states the building, compared to others of similar age and construction is in good condition despite having Asbestos present and that the areas containing Asbestos were found to be in good, encapsulated condition.

The report has been forwarded to our landlord (Williamstown Uniting Church -Electra Street) with the recommendation and request to hire an approved asbestos removalist. We are awaiting their decision and response (October 2024).

In the meantime, we are still able to use the premises provided we do not disturb the asbestos with any building works (eg hammering, drilling, etc). No building and maintenance works can be undertaken without first reading, understanding and signing in to the asbestos registry located on the powerbox in the main entrance corridor according to worksafe regulations.
